



Application Process

Once your child receives a diagnosis of autism, it is important to seek ABA services that will fit your child's needs. To determine if the LOGAN's Autism Learning Centers are a good fit for your child, please complete the following process:

1. Apply

Complete and submit an [Application for ABA Services](#) (link to updated application).

2. Determine Costs

We will determine your insurance coverage and how to access benefits. This process may take between 1 – 2 weeks depending on your insurance company and plan. If you do not have insurance coverage for ABA services, someone from LOGAN will contact you to discuss private pay options, including scholarships.

3. Intake Evaluation

One of our Clinical Directors will schedule an appointment for an observation and intake evaluation for your child.

4. Treatment Recommendations

Following the intake evaluation, the Clinical Director will discuss the types and levels of therapy recommended. If it is recommended that your child receive intensive center-based therapy, services can range from 15-35 hours per week.

5. Determine a start date and schedule

There may be a 2- to 6-week delay in start date depending on vacancies and staffing. Part-time schedules and full-time schedules are available. Your child will be assigned to a classroom and a Program Manager who will provide daily supervision of your child's ABA therapy program.

6. Start Therapy

Your child's first week here consists of introducing them to the new environment and completing a thorough developmental assessment. We use the VB-MAPP and additional tools to determine your child's current skills and needs in the areas of:

- communication
- social skills
- daily living skills

- independent play
- appropriate behavior
- academic readiness

Within 2 weeks of assessment completion, we will provide you with a detailed progress report and treatment plan, including specific goals in the above areas. Specific lesson plans are written to address each goal and introduced in developmental sequence. ABA therapists work 1:1 with your child to help master goals.

7. Monitor Progress

Your child's progress will be assessed daily via data collection. The Clinical Director will meet with you at least twice per month to discuss your child's progress and to train you on methods you can implement in the home. We will also address any concerns you have. Assessments and treatment plans will be updated every 6 months or sooner if needed.
